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

<b>Immunogen</b>	The antiserum was produced against synthesized peptide derived from human ATPAF2. AA range:21-70
<b>Specificity</b>	ATPAF2 Polyclonal Antibody detects endogenous levels of ATPAF2 protein.
<b>Formulation</b>	Liquid in PBS containing 50% glycerol, 0.5% BSA and 0.02% sodium azide.
<b>Storage</b>	Store at -20°C. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

<b>Background</b>	ATP synthase mitochondrial F1 complex assembly factor 2(ATPAF2) Homo sapiens This gene encodes an assembly factor for the F(1) component of the mitochondrial ATP synthase. This protein binds specifically to the F1 alpha subunit and is






thought to prevent this subunit from forming nonproductive homooligomers during enzyme assembly. This gene is located within the Smith-Magenis syndrome region on chromosome 17. An alternatively spliced transcript variant has been described, but its biological validity has not been determined. [provided by RefSeq, Jul 2008],
